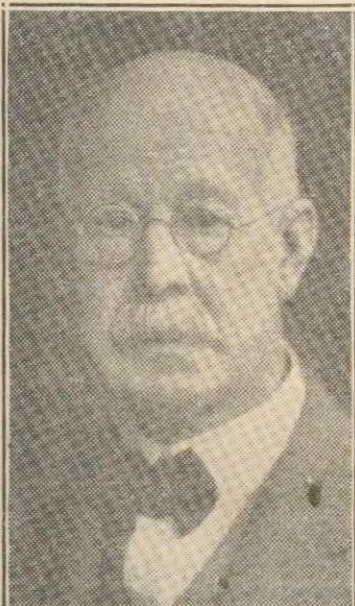

B. W. BROWN DIES AT MT. JOY

Head of Textile Manu- facturing Firm Was 75 Years Old.

Benjamin William Brown, of Mount Joy, president and chairman of the Board of Directors of George Brown's Sons, Inc., textile manufacturers, died at his home at 2:30 o'clock this morning. Death followed a prolonged illness. He was seventy-five years old.

Mr. Brown was the last of seven brothers who, with their father the late George Brown, came to Mount Joy in 1883 and founded the industry which bears the family name.

Born in Philadelphia of English parentage, he attended the Fernwood and Clifton Heights schools until he was twelve years old. At that age he left school and entered the textile industry to be trained by his father.

Following the death of the father the seven sons continued to carry on the business and traditions of the family. One brother, the late Thomas J. Brown, became one of Lancaster county's representatives in the State Legislature and served with distinction.
